Subpart I—Medical Training Generally

SEC. 747. [293k] PRIMARY CARE TRAINING AND ENHANCEMENT.

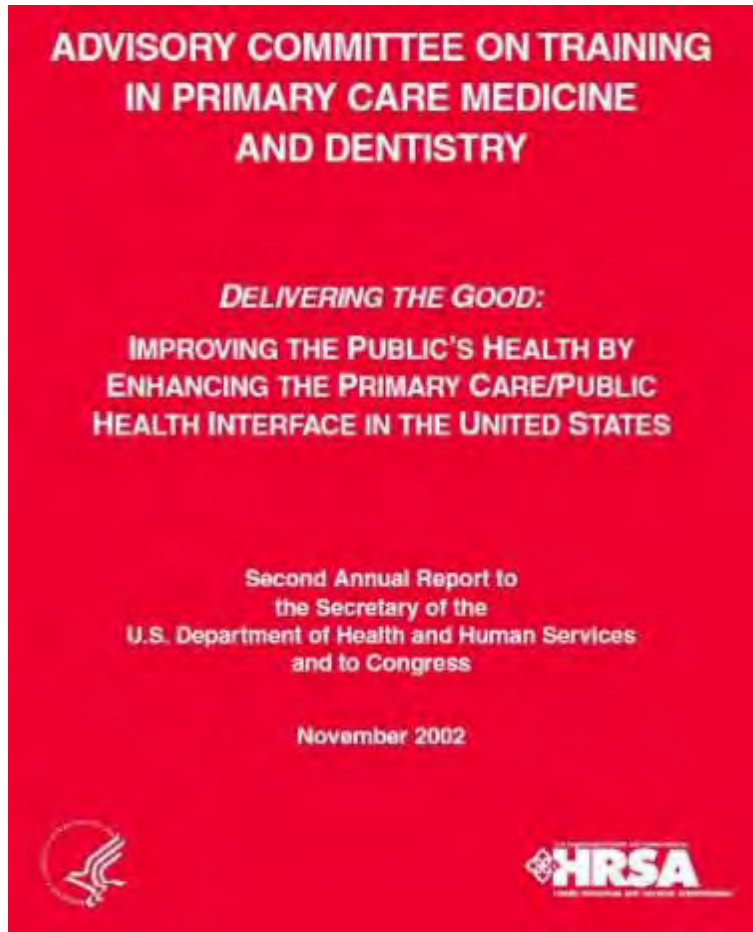
(a) SUPPORT AND DEVELOPMENT OF PRIMARY CARE TRAINING PROGRAMS.—

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(G) to plan, develop, and operate a demonstration program that provides training in new competencies, as recommended by the Advisory Committee on Training in Primary Care Medicine and Dentistry



ACTPCMD 2nd Report



- **RECOMMENDATION II.C.** Encourage **collaboration of Federally funded programs** training public health professionals and Title VII, section 747-funded programs training primary care medical and dental providers.
- **RECOMMENDATION II.H.** Ensure that public health training for primary care physicians, physician assistants, and dentists is **both didactic (classroom based) and experiential (applied)**.
- **RECOMMENDATION II.J.** Encourage collaborations with programs funded by sources other than Title VII, section 747...Title VII, section 747 programs should seek collaborations with these programs, some of which provide models of interdisciplinary efforts, such as those achieved in **preventive medicine residencies** and bioinformatics programs.

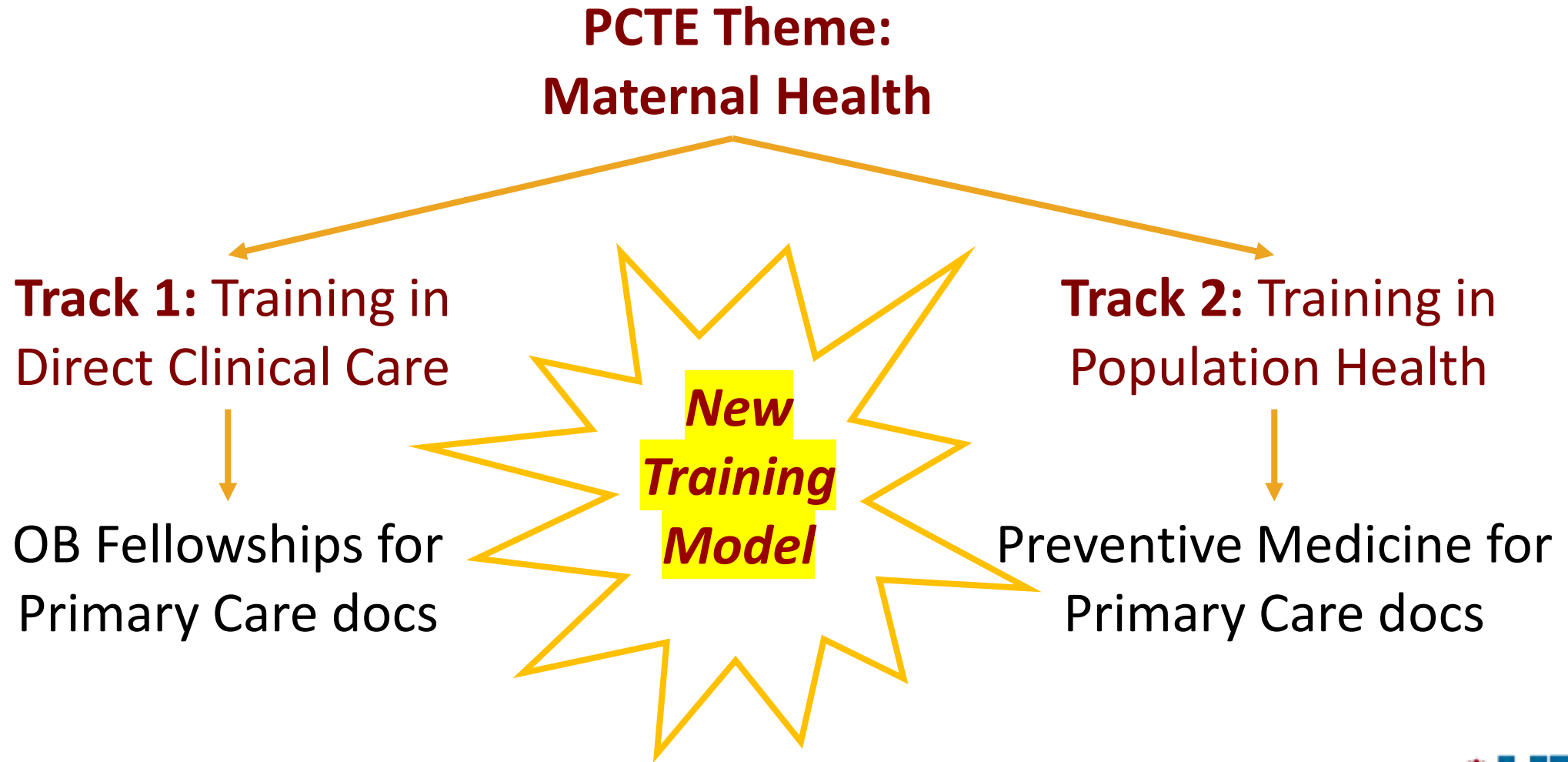
