

Screening mammograms are an important tool in
the early detection of breast cancer.¹³



1.7 million

Pap smears

Pap smears can detect signs of cervical cancer
when it's in the most curable stage.¹⁴ Since 1980,
cervical cancer deaths have dropped by 49% in the
United States largely because of early detection.¹⁵
