Behavioral Health Workforce Development Programs

- ✓ Growing the behavioral health workforce
- ✓ Increasing its capacity
- √ Improving the distribution of providers
- √ Promoting integration of service delivery

Impact:

- ➤ Projected to eliminate over 40% of the projected shortfall of behavioral health providers by 2025
- ► Over 14,000 students graduated and entered the behavioral health workforce between 2014 and 2019
- ▶ 4,849 new paraprofessionals are working as community health workers, peer educators, and substance use/addiction workers

Opioid-Impacted Family Support (OIFSP)

Enhances and expands paraprofessionals' knowledge, skills and expertise, and increases the number of peer support specialists and other behavioral health-related paraprofessionals
