

 - Medical care


Dynamic Immigration Policies

Challenges for DHHS: Coordinating Consequences and Care

- Adapt detention protocols to the evolving challenges and responses to COVID-19
- Ensure that immigration systems are capable (including resources) of quickly adapting to the needs of potentially increased numbers of children and families attempting to enter the US
- Support enhanced coordination of relevant agencies particularly CBP, ICE, ORR
- Consider new, integrated approaches to the custodial and medical care for migrant children and families in US detention
