

MCHB: FY2022 Proposed Total Budget: \$1.5B

Maternal & Child Health Block Grant: +\$110.0 million

- +\$29.0 million for formula awards to states
- +\$81.0 million for Special Projects of Regional and National Significance (SPRANS)

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




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
