WHAT IT DOES

RCORP – Impact will improve access to integrated, coordinated treatment and recovery services for substance use disorder (SUD), including opioid use disorder (OUD), in rural areas. RCORP-Impact has four overarching goals:

<u>Goal 1: Service Delivery:</u> Establish and/or expand coordinated and comprehensive SUD treatment and recovery services.

<u>Goal 2: Workforce:</u> Develop a responsive SUD workforce, which includes both peers and clinical providers with diverse scopes of practice.

<u>Goal 3: Supportive Services:</u> Establish and/or enhance coordination with supportive social services to ensure that rural individuals and families impacted by SUD have the greatest opportunity possible for sustained, long-term recovery.

<u>Goal 4: Sustainability</u>: Develop innovative, multi-sectoral approaches to ensure the continued availability of RCORP-Impact supported services in the target rural service area.

WHO IT SERVES

The target population for RCORP-Impact includes:

- Individuals living in HRSA-designated rural areas who are:
 - At risk for SUD.
 - Experiencing symptoms of SUD.
 - In treatment for SUD.
 - In recovery for SUD.

- Their families and/or caregivers.
- Impacted community members who reside in HRSA-designated rural areas.

RCORP-Impact supported services may only be delivered in HRSA-designated rural counties and rural census tracts, as defined by the <u>Rural Health Grants Eligibility Analyzer</u>.

AWARD INFORMATION

- Approximately \$12 million per year for up to 16 awards (up to \$750,000 per award per year)
- Four-year period of performance (September 1, 2024 August 31, 2028)

WHO CAN APPLY

<u>All</u> domestic public or private, non-profit or forprofit entities are eligible to apply. This includes:

- Community-based organizations
- Federally-recognized tribes
- Tribal organizations
- State Offices of Rural Health
- State, local and territorial governments
- Institutions of higher education
- Faith-based organizations
